## **Iowa Assessments® Accommodations**

There is no finite list of accommodations that are permitted when using the Iowa Assessments. Rather, the national standardization process instructed each school district to apply its policies on IEP or 504 Plans as they related to test administration. The resulting norms included students who were administered the assessments using a variety of accommodations and modifications.
